### SAFEGUARDING POLICY

This policy applies to all staff and anyone else working on behalf of Happy Parenting and/or Happy Parenting with Relax Kids Surrey (hereafter known as Happy Parenting)

### The purpose of this policy:

- To protect children and young people who receive services from Happy Parenting. This includes children of adults who use our services.
- To provide staff and associates with the overarching principles that guide our approach to safeguarding and child protection.

Happy Parenting believes that a child or young person should never experience abuse of any kind. We have a responsibility to promote the welfare of all children and young people and to keep them safe. We are committed to practising in a way that protects them.

# Legal Framework:

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## Happy Parenting recognises that:

- The welfare of the child is paramount, as enshrined in the Children Act 1989
- All children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have a right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- Some children are additionally vulnerable because of the impact of previous experiences, their level of dependency, communication needs or other issues
- Working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers, and other agencies is essential to promoting young people's welfare

## We will seek to keep children and young people safe by:

- Valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- Adopting child protection and safeguarding practices through procedures and a code of conduct
- Providing, where relevant, effective management for staff and associates through appropriate supervision, support and training
- Recruit staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- Recording and storing information professionally and securely, and sharing information about safeguarding and good practice, where appropriate, with children, their families, staff and volunteers
- Using safeguarding procedures to share concerns and relevant information with appropriate agencies where this is in the child's best interest
- Creating and maintaining an anti-bullying environment and ensuring that any bullying issues which arise are dealt with effectively
- Ensuring we have an effective complaints procedure in place
- Ensuring that we provide a safe physical environment for our children, parents and staff
- I may share concerns and relevant information with appropriate agencies where this is in the child's best interest

Happy Parenting is committed to reviewing this policy annually.
